## Firearms Reciprocity Report for 2014

As required by state law, the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General conducted a survey in March of 2014 of those states who currently do not grant reciprocity to individuals who have been issued concealed carry permits by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The survey was sent by U.S. Mail or e-mail to twelve (12) states that do not currently have reciprocity with Pennsylvania. The states contacted were: California, Delaware, Illinois, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Rhode Island, and South Carolina. In addition to this mailing, the Office of Attorney General had contacted Alabama and Nevada earlier in the year.

Following is a breakdown of the responses to the survey:

**Reciprocity is not possible:** Alabama, Delaware, Minnesota, Nebraska, New York, Rhode Island and South Carolina.

**Referral:** Oregon made a referral to the Oregon State Sheriffs' Association that has not responded to date.

**No response to date:** California, Illinois, New Jersey, New Mexico and Ohio.

In addition, on June 26, 2014, the Office of Attorney General entered into a formal reciprocity agreement with the state of Utah. This followed the revocation of Utah's mutual reciprocity based on changes in state law that came to the attention of the Office of Attorney General in May of this year. The agreement permits recognition of carry permits issued to residents of Utah and Pennsylvania. The Commonwealth currently has Reciprocity Agreements with twenty (20) states.

At present the Attorney General has granted statutory reciprocity to eight (8) states under section 6106(b)(15) of the Uniform Firearms Act.
